COMMUNICATING WITH PUBLIC OFFICIALS

Use the Senate or House website to find the contact information for your government official.

When you write, the following tips may help.

- 1. Identify a bill by proper name, contents or number.
- 2. State personal position and give reasons.
- 3. Time the letter to arrive when issue is current. Write letters of commendation when officials do things of which you approve.

VOTING INFORMATION

You are qualified to vote if:

- 1. You are a citizen of the United States.
- 2. You are 18 years of age.
- 3. You are a resident of the State of Michigan and your city, township or village for at least 30 days before Election Day.

registered to vote at www.michigan.gov/vote

4. You are not serving a sentence in jail or prison.

Absentee Voting

You do not need to provide a reason to vote absentee. Absent Voter Applications (in English, Spanish, large print, and fillable pdf) are available online at Michigan.gov/sos. This application, or a letter or postcard including the information, must be received by your clerk's office by mail or delivered in person, in order to deliver a ballot to you. Absentee ballots can be mailed to a voter through 5 pm the Friday before an election. Absentee ballots may be obtained in person at your clerk's office until 4 pm the day before the election or on Election Day. Clerk office hours are mandatory the weekend before an election. The ballot must be returned to the clerk by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Emergency absent voter instructions are on line.

How to register to vote

Within 14 days of an election, you must appear in person at your clerk's office and provide proof of residency. If 15 or more days remain before an election you may register:

- · At a Secretary of State branch office
- At your local clerk's office
- At a Michigan state agency office: Health and Human Services, Community Health, Licensing and Regulatory Affairs
- At Military recruitment centers
- At Voter Registration Drives
- Online at www.Michigan.gov/sos

Note: Your voter registration and driver's license addresses must be the same.

Voting Hours: 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Photo identification OR affidavit is required at the polls.

RUNNING FOR LOCAL OFFICE

Prospective candidates for city council, school board, or municipal judge should consult their city clerk for requirements and filing dates.
